REGISTRATION will take place at the campsite. Students (and their rides) are to arrive between 3:00 – 4:30 p.m. with all of their camp belongings. **PLEASE do not arrive before 3:00 p.m.** Have all luggage packed carefully and labeled with your name. **DO NOT** unload any luggage prior to checking in. The items you **DO** need to have unpacked and available for registration are the following:

- Band Camp Fees (Paulette Ivan, our treasurer will be collecting unpaid fees and current band camp amounts due)
- Any medications that you need during the week to turn into the nurse. (Over the counter medication permission slips need to be turned in PRIOR to start of camp)
- Emergency Medical Form (mandatory for band camp)
- Consent for Administration of Over the Counter Medications Form
- Image Consent Form
- Designated snack item for you class. (see snack sheet)
- If you are leaving camp for any reason prior to Friday, July 30th please have your parent note with you during registration. You will turn that note into Marissa Priest during registration
- You may bring the forms that were sent out by the Band Boosters and turn them in as well during registration.

Parents and friends are asked to depart from camp by 4:30 p.m. so that we may successfully open camp. NO students will be permitted to drive their own cars to camp, so do not ask. Parents will be called to pick you up if you do. NO Exceptions will be made.

Dear Band Student,

The following is a list of essential items to get you through this week. Our goal for the week is not only to learn our first half-time show and pre-game, but also to develop lasting friendships and camaraderie within the band members and staff. We have no doubt that each of you will work hard this week. With hard work, however; comes discipline, character, and the self-gratification that leads to good habits way after your years in the band have been accomplished. This packet will provide you with the guidelines for a successful week!

BAND CAMP PACKING LIST

These items are **MANDATORY** for rehearsal this week:

- Instrument and music book**
- SUMMER BAND UNIFORMS**
- Water Bottle (mandatory for field rehearsal)
- Mechanical pencil (2)
- Reeds/Slide Oil/cork grease, etc
- Hat/Visor/sunglasses

These items can be used as a guide for packing:

- All luggage must be labeled with your full name
- Pillows (this is the item that is forgotten the most)
- Linens-for use on a twin bed or sleeping bag

- Snacks that do not need refrigeration - for cabins
- Sunscreen
- Bug Spray
- Comfortable clothes for outside-students are **not** permitted to wear jeans for field rehearsal or to wear long pants on hot humid days. Be prepared for all types of weather. (shorts, sweats/yoga pants)
- Rain Gear
- Toiletries (Toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, soap, shampoo, etc.)
- Alarm Clock (preferably the battery kind, the outlets are limited in cabins)
- Extra pair of shoes in addition to your REQUIRED Tennis shoes
- LOTS of socks (at least two pairs for each day)
- Swim Suit (appropriate for camp setting)
- Small fan if desired (try to fit in suitcase)
- Tour Band Shirt will be distributed at band camp

ATTENDANCE AND GRADING POLICY

Attendance Guidelines

Students are expected to attend all practices and performances for the Big Red Band. Conflicts may arise and should be submitted to Mr. Carver in writing PRIOR to the event or as soon as you become aware of them. Reasons for any absence given AFTER the event will not be given the same consideration as ones with prior knowledge. Absences that should be avoided (and can be with proper communication with all parties) are work schedules, doctor's appointments, private lessons or other rehearsal commitments, and family vacations. Attendance is part of the grading scale for the marching band season and missing practices and/or events will not be acceptable without prior knowledge of Mr. Carver. Failure to follow the attendance policy may result in sitting on the sidelines for a Friday night.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Cell Phone Guidelines

Cell phones ARE limited to down time in the cabin area. Phones are NOT to be brought to the field, sectional rehearsal, full band rehearsal, other practice times, or during meals. If you are found using a cell phone during the listed activities a chaperon may take your phone away from you, and you will have to see them after evening event to get it back.

Please limit phone use to necessary phone calls only.

During the marching band season no cell phones are permitted on the field or with the student, phones will be left in the band room or on the buses. If seen using a cell phone, the cell phone will be taken away from the student and will be given back to them when we return to the high school.

BAND CAMP VISITORS

Visitors are not permitted during camp. If an emergency arrives, parents should contact Marissa Priest through the camp phone number, located in this packet. She will get with Mr. Carver and the student.

Behavior/Illegal Substances Policy:

The following will occur with any use or finding of illegal substances. Two phone calls made by Mr. Carver: 1) to the police and 2) to the principal informing him of the phone call to the police.

Extreme poor judgment and/or behavior may result in dismissal from camp and removal from the band program. Parents will be responsible for picking up their child at the time of the infraction.

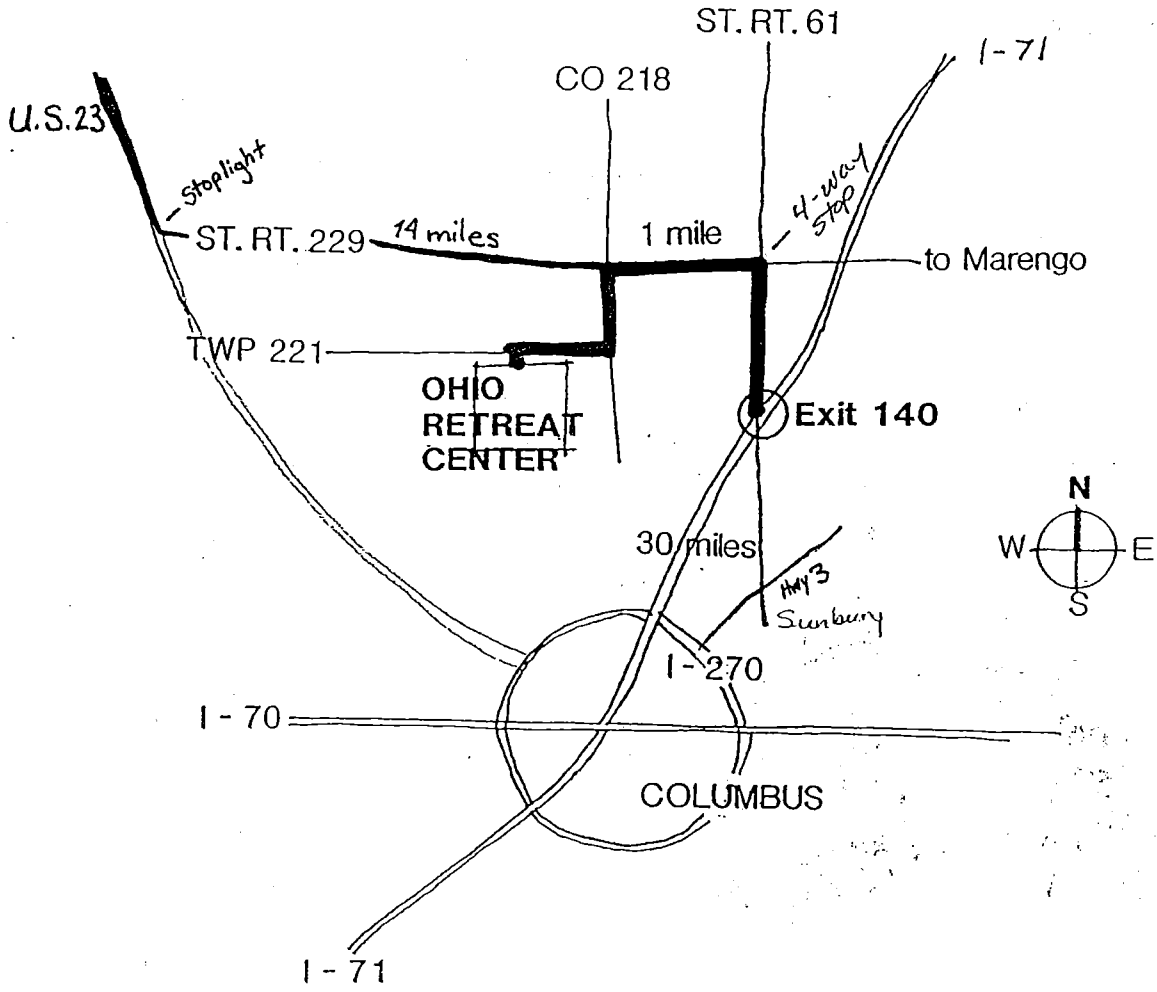

SECTION 3313.712, OHIO REVISED CODE
(Pursuant to H.B. 811 and H.B. 639)
(Effective 6-11-92)

(A) Annually the board of education of each city, exempted village, local, and joint vocational school district shall, before the first day of October, provide to the parent of every pupil enrolled in schools under the board's jurisdiction, an emergency medical authorization form that is an identical copy of the form contained in division (B) of this section. Thereafter, the board shall, within thirty days after the entry of any pupil into a public school in this state for the first time, provide his parent, either as part of any registration form which is in use in the district, or as a separate form, an identical copy of the form contained in division (B) of this section. When the form is returned to the school with Part I or Part II completed, the school shall keep the form on file, and shall send the form to any school of a city, exempted village, local or joint vocational school district to which the pupil is transferred. Upon request of his parent, authorities of the school in which the pupil is enrolled may permit the parent to make changes in a previously filed form, or to file a new form.

If a parent does not wish to give such written permission, he shall indicate in the proper place on the form the procedure he wishes school authorities to follow in the event of a medical emergency involving his child.

Even if a parent gives written consent for emergency medical treatment, when a pupil becomes ill or is injured and requires emergency medical treatment while under school authority, or while engaged in an extra-curricular activity authorized by the appropriate school authorities, the authorities of his school shall make reasonable attempts to contact the parent before treatment is given. The school shall present the pupil's emergency medical authorization form or copy thereof to the hospital or practitioner rendering treatment.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to impose liability on any school official or school employee who, in good faith, attempts to comply with this section.

IN THE EVENT REASONABLE ATTEMPTS TO CONTACT ME HAVE BEEN UNSUCCESSFUL, I HEREBY GIVE MY CONSENT FOR (1) THE ADMINISTRATION OF ANY TREATMENT DEEMED NECESSARY BY ABOVE-NAMED DOCTOR, OR IN THE EVENT THE DESIGNATED PREFERRED PRACTITIONER IS NOT AVAILABLE, BY ANOTHER LICENSED PHYSICIAN OR DENTIST; AND (2) THE TRANSFER OF THE CHILD TO ANY HOSPITAL REASONABLY ACCESSIBLE.

Consent for Administration of Over the Counter Medications

You have been asked to send any medications to camp that your child takes on a regular basis. From past experience, we have found that there are many "unanticipated" needs for over-the-counter medications, such as headaches, muscle aches, colds, minor sore throats, and ailments during camp and other band events. We do have medications available for these needs. As our band grows, the list of medications and kids we are responsible for has greatly increased. For the safety and health of your children, we are asking for written consent before administering any medications. There will be a record kept of what medications are given so that appropriate doses are given. You will always be called in the event of any serious illness or injury, fever, or at any time your child or any of the camp staff feels that you should be called. Please mark an "X" by any of the following medications that you give permission for your child to receive if needed.

_____ Ibuprofen (Motrin, Advil) for headaches, sore muscles, sore throat;

_____ Sudafed for colds or congestion;

_____ Benadryl for allergies, itching;

_____ Tylenol for headache, sore muscles sore throat;

_____ Pectin throat lozenges for sore throat (usually from yelling!);

_____ Dextromethorphan (Robitussin DM) for cough.
